ALL ABOUT PIGS

In Saskatchewan we have about 140 hog farms that raise about 2 million pigs every year. Pork is the delicious meat that comes from pigs. It's where we get pork chops, hot dogs, sausages and bacon!

Many years ago, most Canadians lived on farms and grew their own food. They raised animals like chickens, cows and pigs and also grew crops such as wheat, barley, corn and peas. This was used to feed their families and farm animals.

Today, since most Canadians no longer live on farms, modern farms have gotten much bigger and are able to grow larger amounts of food to feed billions of people around the world.

Where do pigs live?

Pigs are raised in modern barns that have heat and air conditioning to keep them warm and comfortable in our cold winters and cool in the hot summers.

What do pigs eat?

Pigs eat a variety of grains and legumes like barley, corn, soybeans, peas and wheat. Vitamins and minerals are sometimes added to the pigs feed to make sure they are getting all the nutrients they need to grow and stay healthy!



This picture shows a small farm. The average hog farm in Saskatchewan has 7,000 pigs. Some hog farms have 2000-5000 sows (mother pigs) and boars (male pigs). Now that's a busy place!

Pig Facts

How big does a pig grow?

Pigs can reach more than 300 kgs if they are fed for many years. They will grow from 2.2 kg (1 lb) to 180 kgs (220-280 lbs) in six months.

Do pigs make good pets?

While new born piglets are very cute and cuddly, they do grow very fast and most of us just wouldn't have the room in our house to raise a pig to full grown. They are farm animals and happy in small herds of pigs of the same size and age.

How do pigs communicate?

They grunt to talk to one another and have about 20 different vocalizations (sounds) that all mean different things. Some mean I'm hungry, or I'm thirsty, or I like you!

Are there a lot of pigs in Saskatchewan?

Raising pigs is the third biggest agriculture sector in Saskatchewan, behind grains and oilseeds, and raising cows for beef.

Piglet: newborn pig weighing 1-2 kg


Runt: smallest pig in the litter






Did you Know?

In invisible Connect the dots to see one of these special trucks!




Pork is very nutritious and has protein that our bodies need to build muscle. It also has vitamins and minerals for strong bones, teeth, and eyes!
